SECTION A: ENVIRONMENTAL (NATIONAL)

Plant Improvement Act 53 of 1976 ("PIA"):

1. Notice revises the Deciduous Fruit Plant Certification Scheme, issued under section 23 of the Plant Improvement Act 53 of 1976. The updated scheme replaces the previous schedule and stipulates new phytosanitary standards, including mandatory testing for specific viral diseases and visual inspections for a range of bacterial, fungal, and physiological disorders affecting deciduous fruit plants. Published in GG 53293 NN 6575 dated 5 September 2025.

National Land Transport Amendment Act 23 of 2023 ("NLTAA"):

2. Notice brings into effect the National Land Transport Amendment Act 23 of 2023, issued under section 56(1) of the principal Act. This proclamation activates the provisions of the Amendment Act, which aims to refine and enhance the regulatory framework governing land transport in South Africa. The Act officially commences on the date of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53335 NN 289 dated 12 September 2025.

National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998 ("NEMA"):

3. Notice regarding the adoption of the Generic Environmental Management Programme for the Kruger National Park as an environmental management instrument, issued under section 24(2)(e) of the National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998. This instrument outlines measures to avoid, manage, and mitigate environmental impacts associated with maintenance, development, and expansion activities within designated use zones of the park. Published in GG 53335 NN 6608 dated 12 September 2025.

National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act 10 of 2004 ("NEMA:BA"):

4. Notice announces the intention to set a zero-export *quota* for trade in lion bones sourced from captive breeding operations in South Africa for the 2025 calendar year. Issued under sections 99 and 100 of the National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act 10 of 2004, and regulation 3(2)(k) and (f) of the CITES Regulations, this proposal outlines the government's stance against the domestication and exploitation of lions. Published in GG 53394 NN 6663 dated 22 September 2025.

SECTION B: SAFETY, HEALTH & OTHER (NATIONAL)

Labour Relations Act 66 of 1995 ("LRA"):

5. Notice introduces the revised Code of Good Practice: Dismissal, issued under section 203(2A) of the Labour Relations Act 66 of 1995. This Code replaces Schedule 8 and the 1999 Code on Operational Requirements, and provides comprehensive guidance on fair dismissal procedures, misconduct handling, probation, incapacity, and retrenchment processes. It outlines principles of fairness, procedural requirements, and employer obligations across various dismissal scenarios. Published in GG 53294 NN 3470 dated 4 September 2025.

Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 130 of 1993 ("COIDA"):

6. Notice communicates the updated banking arrangements for the Compensation Fund, issued under the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 130 of 1993. It outlines the exclusive use of newly designated Nedbank accounts for various payment categories, including Return of Earnings, pension, medical, compensation, and procurement-related transactions. Published in GG 53360 NN 3495 dated 19 September 2025.

Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act 78 of 1973 ("ODIMWA"):

7. Notice declares a list of mines as controlled mines and designates associated activities as risk work, issued under sections 10 and 13 of the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act 78 of 1973. This declaration identifies specific mining operations across multiple provinces and outlines hazardous tasks such as underground excavations, mineral handling, crushing, smelting, and laboratory work. These measures aim to regulate occupational health risks and ensure compliance with disease prevention protocols. Published in GG 53360 NN 6625 dated 19 September 2025.

Railway Safety Act 30 of 2024 ("RSA"):

8. Notice sets forth the Determination of Safety Management Systems and Safety Management System Reports, issued under section 37 of the Railway Safety Act 30 of 2024. This determination prescribes the format, structure, and content of safety management systems required for various categories of railway safety permits, including procedures for submission, review, and amendment. Published in GG 53360 NN 6632 dated 19 September 2025.

SECTION C: DRAFT SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL FOR COMMENT (DRAFT NATIONAL LEGISLATION AND REGULATIONS)

The World Heritage Convention Act 49 of 1999 ("WHCA"):

9. Notice invites nominations for appointment to the Board of the iSimangaliso Wetland Park Authority, issued under section 14 of the World Heritage Convention Act 49 of 1999. Appointees will serve from 1 April 2026 to 31 March 2029 in their personal capacities. Members of the public are invited to submit nominations within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53290 NN 6572 dated 3 September 2025.

National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998 ("NEMA"):

10. Notice proposes the extension of the Environmental Assessment Practitioners Association of South Africa (EAPASA) as the sole registration authority, issued under section 24H(3) read with section 24H(6) of the National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998. This proposal outlines the rationale for continued appointment to allow for sustainable regulatory planning and law reform regarding environmental assessment practitioners. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53291 NN 6573 dated 3 September 2025.

Standards Act 8 of 2008 ("SA"):

11. Notice introduces a series of draft standards for public comment, issued under section 23(2)(a)(ii) of the Standards Act 8 of 2008. These drafts propose updates and new specifications across various sectors, including electric vehicle infrastructure, civil engineering testing methods, information technology, and environmental reporting. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments on or before 28 October 2025. Published in GG 53304 NN 3481 dated 5 September 2025.

Merchant Shipping Act 57 of 1951 ("MSA"):

12. Notice introduces the draft Merchant Shipping (National Small Vessel Safety) Regulations, issued under section 356(1) of the Merchant Shipping Act 57 of 1951. These draft regulations outline vessel safety certification requirements, construction standards, crew training obligations, operational limitations, environmental protection measures, and enforcement provisions for small commercial and pleasure vessels operating in South African waters. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53304 NN 3482 dated 5 September 2025.

National Nuclear Regulator Act 47 of 1999 ("NNRA"):

13. Notice calls for nominations to the Board of the National Nuclear Regulator, issued under section 8(7)(a) of the National Nuclear Regulator Act of 1999. The notice outlines eligibility criteria, documentation requirements, and submission procedures. Members of the public are invited to submit nominations on or before 30 September 2025. Published in GG 53336 NN 6613 dated 12 September 2025.

National Water Act 36 of 1998 ("NWA"):

14. Notice proposes the determination of water resource classes and associated Resource Quality Objectives for the Lephalala, Mogalakwena, Sand, Nzhelele, and Luvuvhu catchments in the Limpopo Water Management Area, and the Shingwedzi catchment in the Olifants Water Management Area. Issued under section 13(4) of the National Water Act 36 of 1998. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 60 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53360 NN 6633 dated 19 September 2025.

Civil Aviation Act 13 of 2009 ("CAA"):

15. Notice invites public comment on the Draft Airfreight Strategy for South Africa, issued by the Department of Transport. Developed as part of a broader review of civil aviation policy under the Department's mandate, the strategy puts forth a framework to enhance the airfreight sub-sector's role in national economic development. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 working days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53426 NN 3529 dated 26 September 2025.

Plant Health (Phytosanitary) Act 35 of 2024 ("PHA"):

- 16. Notice introduces Draft Control Measures under the Plant Health (Phytosanitary) Act 35 of 2024, issued in terms of section 4 of the Act. These measures outline prohibitions on the keeping, cultivation, and movement of plants and regulated articles to prevent the spread of quarantine pests. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53424 NN 6664 dated 26 September 2025.
- 17. Notice introduces the Draft Export Regulations under the Plant Health (Phytosanitary) Act 35 of 2024, issued in terms of section 30 read with sections 14, 15, 16, and 23 of the Act. These draft regulations outline registration requirements, phytosanitary certification procedures, inspection protocols, designated points of exit, and conditions for re-export and in-transit consignments of plants and plant products. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53424 NN 6665 dated 26 September 2025.
- 18. Notice introduces the Draft Regulations for the Importation of Regulated Articles Without a Permit, issued under section 30 read with section 13(2) of the Plant Health (Phytosanitary) Act 35 of 2024. These draft regulations outline exemptions for specific plant materials, seeds, timber, and other regulated articles, detailing conditions such as inspection protocols, phytosanitary certification, pest-free declarations, and designated points of entry. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53424 NN 6666 dated 26 September 2025.
- 19. Notice introduces the Draft Import Regulations under the Plant Health (Phytosanitary) Act 35 of 2024, issued in terms of section 30 read with sections 12, 13, and 23 of the Act. These draft regulations lay down conditions for the importation of plants, plant products, and other regulated articles, including permit application procedures, inspection protocols, designated points of entry, extended detention provisions, post-entry quarantine requirements, and risk assessment for biological control agents. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 30 days of publication of this notice. Published in GG 53424 NN 6667 dated 26 September 2025.

Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 ("POPIA"):

20. Notice introduces Draft Regulations relating to the processing of a data subject's health or sex life by certain responsible parties, issued under section 112(2)(c) of the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013. These draft regulations outline conditions under which sensitive personal information may be lawfully processed, including safeguards, consent requirements, and oversight mechanisms. The Information Regulator invites public comment in terms of section 113(3)(c) of the Act. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments on or before 10 October 2025. Published in GG 53426 NN 6673 dated 26 September 2025.

SECTION D: SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL (PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION AND MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS)

Free State Province

21. Notice introduces the Spatial Development Framework (SDF) 2025–2030 for the Mafube Local Municipality, adopted under section 20 of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013. This framework outlines spatial policies, strategic objectives, implementation mechanisms, and capital investment plans applicable to the municipality, replacing the 2012 SDF. Published in PG 5493 NN 66 dated 5 September 2025.

22. Notice acknowledges the acceptance of an application for a Production Right by Motuoane Energy (Pty) Ltd, issued under section 83 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act 28 of 2002. The application outlines plans for phased development and commercial extraction of natural gas and Helium across various farms in the Virginia, Ventersburg, Winburg, and Theunissen magisterial districts. Published in PG 8896 NN 56 dated 19 September 2025.

Gauteng Province

- 23. Notice initiates the Environmental Authorisation Application Process for the recommencement of tailings deposition at the Mponeng Lower Compartment Tailings Storage Facility, issued under Chapter 6 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations promulgated in terms of the National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998. The notice outlines the scope of the proposed mining-related activities, affected land parcels, and invites public participation in the scoping and impact assessment process. Published in PG 320 NN 688 dated 3 September 2025.
- 24. Notice adopts the Lesedi Local Municipality Land Use Scheme, 2025, issued under section 24 of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013 and section 22 of the Lesedi Local Municipality Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-law of 2015. This scheme sets forth updated land use regulations applicable across the entire municipal jurisdiction, replacing the 2018 scheme. Published in PG 351 NN 151 dated 30 September 2025.

KwaZulu-Natal Province

- 25. Notice enacts the Air Quality Management By-law for the uMgungundlovu District Municipality, issued under section 13 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000, read with section 162 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996. This by-law sets forth local emission standards, permitting procedures, nuisance abatement measures, licensing requirements for listed activities, and enforcement mechanisms to regulate air pollution and protect public health and the environment. It includes provisions for dust control, dark smoke emissions, fuel-burning equipment, pesticide spraying, and noise pollution. Published in PG 2849 NN 661 dated 11 September 2025.
- 26. Notice enacts the Problem Buildings By-law for the Richmond Municipality, issued under section 156 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, read with section 11 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. This by-law sets forth procedures for identifying, declaring, and rehabilitating buildings deemed derelict, overcrowded, illegally occupied, structurally unsound, or associated with criminal activity. It outlines prohibited conduct, compliance obligations, enforcement powers, penalties, and appeal mechanisms to ensure safe and habitable urban environments. Published in PG 2849 NN 665 dated 11 September 2025.
- 27. Notice enacts the Msunduzi Municipality Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-law, 2025, issued under section 25(1) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000 and section 20(1) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013. This by-law outlines procedures for land use applications, zoning amendments, township establishment, appeals, enforcement mechanisms, and the roles of municipal planning authorities. Published in PG 2852 NN 668 dated 18 September 2025.
- 28. Notice adopts the KwaZulu-Natal Coastal Management Programme 2024–2029, issued under section 46(3)(a) of the National Environmental Management: Integrated Coastal Management Act 24 of 2008. This programme outlines strategic coastal governance priorities, environmental protection objectives, sustainable development goals, and implementation mechanisms for managing the province's coastal zone. Published in PG 2852 NN 974 dated 18 September 2025.
- 29. Notice promulgates the uMngeni Municipality Integrated Waste Management By-laws, issued under section 13 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. These by-laws lay down comprehensive provisions for the regulation of waste avoidance, minimisation, generation, collection, separation, storage, transportation, treatment, recycling, and disposal. They introduce obligations for waste generators, licensing requirements for service providers, enforcement mechanisms, penalties for non-

- compliance, and the establishment of a District Inter-Municipal Waste Management Forum. Published in PG 2853 NN 146 dated 25 September 2025.
- 30. Notice enacts the uMgungundlovu District Municipality: Municipal Environmental Health By-law, issued under section 13 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000, read with section 162 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996. These by-laws outline comprehensive provisions for environmental health governance, including principles of public health, regulation of offensive trades, waste and pollution control, food safety, vector management, and the duties and powers of environmental health practitioners. Published in PG 2853 NN 670 dated 25 September 2025.

Mpumalanga Province

- 31. Notice promulgates the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality Cemeteries, Crematoria and Undertakers Bylaws, issued under section 12 of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Act 117 of 1998. These by-laws prescribe procedures for the establishment and management of cemeteries, crematoria operations, burial and cremation protocols, exhumation conditions, pauper burials, memorial work standards, and funeral undertaker registration. They also stipulate prohibited conduct, penalties, and repeal previous cemetery-related by-laws. Published in PG 3857 NN 569 dated 5 September 2025.
- 32. Notice confirms the adoption of the Emakhazeni Spatial Development Framework (ESDF) 2025, enacted under Section 20(1) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013, together with Section 8(9) of the Emakhazeni Local Municipality By-Law of 2015. This framework presents a comprehensive spatial strategy for the municipality, endorsed by the Nkangala District Municipality, and aims to support integrated and sustainable land use planning. Published in PG 3858 NN 702 dated 12 September 2025.
- 33. Notice approves the Thembisile Hani Spatial Development Framework (THSDF) 2025, issued under Section 20(1) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013, read with Section 8(9) of the Thembisile Hani Local Municipality Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-Law of 2015. This framework lays out strategic spatial planning policies for the entire municipal area, endorsed in collaboration with the Nkangala District Municipality. Published in PG 3858 GN 701 dated 12 September 2025.
- 34. Notice enacts the Water Services By-laws for the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality, issued under section 13 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000, read with sections 156 and 162 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996. These by-laws lay down comprehensive provisions for water supply and sanitation services, including service levels, application procedures, tariffs, payment obligations, installation standards, pollution prevention, water audits, and industrial effluent disposal. Published in PG 3866 NN 577 dated 26 September 2025.

North West Province

- 35. Notice initiates the Section 24G Rectification Application Process for the RCW concrete batching plant, issued under Chapter 6 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations promulgated in terms of the National Environmental Management Act 107 of 1998. The application outlines the intent to regularise listed activities commenced without prior Environmental Authorisation, including activities under GN R983 (Activity 27) and GN R985 (Activities 10, 12, and 14), as well as water uses under Section 21(a), (c), and (i) of the National Water Act 36 of 1998. The process includes public participation and may identify additional activities. Published in PG 8896 NN 501 dated 9 September 2025.
- 36. Notice adopts the Kgetlengrivier Spatial Development Framework (SDF), 2025, issued under section 20(1) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013 and section 8(9)(a) of the Kgetlengrivier Local Municipality By-Law on Municipal Spatial Planning and Land Use Management. This framework puts forth a long-term strategic policy to guide spatial planning, infrastructure investment, land-use decisions, and sustainable development across the municipal area. It replaces all previously adopted SDFs and promotes integrated human settlements, spatial transformation, and sound environmental management. Published in PG 8899 NN 1222 dated 16 September 2025.

- 37. Notice enacts the Rustenburg Local Municipality Air Pollution Control By-law, issued under section 156(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996. This by-law lays down emission control measures for soot, smoke, dust, domestic and industrial waste burning, tyre and rubber product combustion, and spray-painting activities. It prescribes local emission standards, mandates the appointment of air quality officers, outlines enforcement procedures, and sets penalties for non-compliance. The regulation also introduces permitting requirements for activities such as sandblasting, concrete mixing, and pesticide spraying. Published in PG 8901 NN 1124 dated 18 September 2025.
- 38. Notice enacts the Rustenburg Local Municipality Integrated Waste Management By-law, issued under section 156(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996. This by-law puts forth comprehensive provisions governing waste minimisation, recycling, collection, transportation, and disposal. It outlines obligations for waste generators, licensing requirements for service providers, enforcement mechanisms, and penalties for non-compliance. The regulation also introduces controls for hazardous, industrial, agricultural, and electronic waste, and promotes sustainable waste practices aligned with national legislation. Published in PG 8902 NN 1125 dated 18 September 2025.
- 39. Notice promulgates the Waste Management By-law for the Ratlou Local Municipality, issued under section 156(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 and section 9(3)(a–d) of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act 59 of 2008. This by-law sets forth obligations for waste generators, outlines the duties of waste management officers, regulates service providers, and prescribes standards for waste storage, collection, transportation, recycling, and disposal. It also introduces provisions for litter control, nuisance prevention, hazardous waste handling, and penalties for non-compliance. Published in PG 8905 PN 1230 dated 23 September 2025.

Western Cape Province

- 40. Notice enacts the Integrated Waste Management By-law for the Theewaterskloof Municipality, issued under section 156(2) of the Constitution and section 11(3)(m) of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. This by-law lays down provisions for waste minimisation, recycling, hazardous waste handling, service provider accreditation, enforcement mechanisms, and penalties for non-compliance. It replaces the 2015 Waste Management By-law and aims to promote sustainable development and environmental protection through structured municipal and commercial waste services. Published in PG 9129 dated 5 September 2025.
- 41. Notice amends the Mossel Bay Municipality By-law Relating to Community Fire Safety. These amendments introduce updated definitions for hazardous material and mobile filling stations, revise provisions on dust accumulation, combustible substances, and flammable goods thresholds, and establish certification requirements for hazardous goods transport. The changes also align liquefied petroleum gas installations with applicable SANS standards and expand service-of-document procedures to include electronic communication. Published in PG 9132 dated 5 September 2025.

SECTION E: SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL (DRAFT PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION AND MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS)

Eastern Cape Province

- 42. Notice announces the Water Use License Application (WULA) for the Khayamnandi Extension Phase 5, issued under section 41(4) of the National Water Act 36 of 1998. The application pertains to water uses under sections 21(c) and (i), within the Nelson Mandela Bay Municipal area. Members of the public are invited to submit comments on or before 9 November 2025. Published in PG 5493 NN 189 dated 8 September 2025.
- 43. Notice introduces the Draft Municipal Spatial Development Framework (MSDF) for Nelson Mandela Bay Municipality, issued under section 20(3)(a–c) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013, read with section 28(3) of the Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. Members of the public are invited to submit comments on or before 7 November 2025. Published in PG 5495 NN 1492 dated 9 September 2025.

Gauteng Province

- 44. Notice initiates the stakeholder engagement process for the proposed review of the City of Ekurhuleni Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-law (2019), issued under the authority of the municipal council in alignment with the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments on or before 9 October 2025. Published in PG 323 GN 691 dated 3 September 2025.
- 45. Notice introduces the Draft Electricity Supply By-law for public comment, issued under section 7 of the Rationalisation of Local Government Affairs Act 10 of 1998, read with sections 12, 13, and 21 of the Municipal Systems Act 32 of 2000. The proposed by-law outlines provisions for the regulation, management, and enforcement of electricity supply within the Midvaal Local Municipality. It sets forth conditions for service delivery, environmental sustainability, access to electricity, and penalties for non-compliance. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments on or before 29 October 2025. Published in PG 345 NN 1174 dated 24 September 2025.

Limpopo Province

46. Notice initiates the review of the Lephalale Municipal Spatial Development Framework, issued under section 20(3) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013, read with sections 6, 8, and 9 of the Lephalale Municipal Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-law of 2017. This draft framework puts forth updated spatial policies, strategic planning objectives, and implementation mechanisms aligned with the Provincial SDF and recent demographic data, aiming to address key spatial challenges and guide sustainable development. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments within 60 days of publication of this notice. Published in PG 3735 NN 654 dated 12 September 2025.

Mpumalanga Province

47. Notice announces the intention to review the Lekwa Local Municipality Spatial Development Framework (SDF) of 2017, issued under Section 6(b) of the Lekwa Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-Law, 2016. The review aims to formulate a strategic and policy framework addressing spatial, social, environmental, and economic challenges within the municipality. Published in PG 3858 NN 700 dated 12 September 2025.

North West Province

48. Notice introduces the Draft Ramotshere Moiloa Land Use Scheme, issued under section 24(1) of the Spatial Planning and Land Use Management Act 16 of 2013, read with section 21 of the Ramotshere Moiloa Spatial Planning and Land Use Management By-law of 2017.
